### Academic Entry Requirements

Applicants must have completed a Vocational Graduate Certificate in Christian Ministry and Theology or equivalent. You will need a reference from your local Pastor and must fulfil all enrolment requirements. Applicants under 18 years of age must have parental/guardian approval. Overseas students have no English language requirements, unless otherwise stated as per the Department of Immigration and Citizenship (DIAC) student visa requirements.

### Course Structure

The Vocational Graduate Diploma in Christian Ministry and Theology requires the successful completion of 6 subjects over 2 terms (3 subjects per term). Overseas students are required to complete an extra subject each term (total of 8 subjects).

### Assessment

Exercises, questions, case scenarios, research and workplace competency.

### Vocational Placement (VP)

In addition to study time students are required to complete 120 hours of volunteer work within their local church and/or a community based organisation. This volunteer work is called "Vocational Placement". Vocational Graduate Diploma students are expected to minister in a leadership role within their local church and/or community organisation, where they are required to develop others.

### Recognition of Prior Learning

Recognition of Prior Learning (RPL) is a process where students may be granted credit towards a qualification in recognition of their prior skills and knowledge gained through work experience, life experience and/or formal training. ### Workload

Full time: 3 subjects plus 60 hours VP per term (2 terms)  
Overseas students: 4 subjects plus 60 hours VP per term (2 terms)  
Part time: 1 or 2 subjects plus 20 hours VP per subject per term
